Emerald Ash Borer Treatment Options

Presentation by Pam Zipse and Nicholas Polanin of Rutgers
University

The dreaded Emerald Ash Borer is in our community and thousands of ash trees are now under threat. The damage has been devastating, killing true ash trees all across America. If you want to save the tree,



you have to act quickly. What can you do? Pam Zipse, Outreach Coordinator of the Rutgers Urban Forestry Program of the NJ Agricultural Experiment Station and Nicholas Polanin, Somerset County Agent, will walk you through your options, including a

Integrated Pest Management for the Homeowner

Integrated Pest Management is a strategy and decision process developed for large agricultural producers that can also be applied by homeowners to limit or avoid altogether the use of toxic chemicals. You will learn how to use these principles for long-term prevention of pests and their damage through a combination of techniques such as biological control, habitat manipulation, modification of cultural practices, and use of resistant varieties. Whether you hire a professional landscaper or do it all yourself, you need to know the very best practices.




